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Map Skills

Be a Map Detective

The lines of latitude and longitude help us to accurately locate places on a map. Latitude lines run east and west. The most important latitude line is the equator, which is halfway between the North and South Poles and is numbered 0 degrees. The other lines of latitude show distances that are north and south of the equator. Longitude lines run north and south. The most important longitude line is the prime meridian.

Figure out which states are being described by the following latitude and longitude locations. Use the map to help you. (Note: $^{\circ}$ = degrees)

Example: 30° north latitude, 100° west longitude would be Texas.

- 1. 105° west longitude, 35° north latitude
- 2. 95° west longitude, 45° north latitude
- 3. 120° west longitude, 45° north latitude
- 4. 85° west longitude, 45° north latitude

Graphs and charts contain information that can be read quickly. One type of graph is called a pictograph. In a pictograph, pictures are used in place of numbers. Look at the example below. It charts the grapefruit production of the U.S.A. Each grapefruit symbol represents 2,000,000 boxes of grapefruit. According to this graph, Florida is the leading producer.
